Dr. Thomas L. Kiedis was named LBC | Capital's sixth president on February 1, 2020, after 10 years of service as the Senior Pastor at Spanish River Church in Boca Raton, Florida. Kiedis started at Spanish River Church in 2007 as director of leadership development, served in a dual role for two years and became senior pastor in 2009. Prior to Spanish River Church, Kiedis served as Dean of the Chapel and Assistant Professor of Ministry at Palm Beach Atlantic University.

Kiedis earned his Bachelor of Science from Crichton College, Master of Arts in Religious Education from Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary, Doctor of Ministry from Fuller Theological Seminary and Doctor of Philosophy in Leadership Studies from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia of gown and hood are believed to have had their beginnings at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carryover from the times when the clergy who operated the universities wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter or to collect alms when worn as shoulder capes.

While originating from medieval times, academic attire has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any trappings of rank or social standing underneath. Gowns are usually designed with pointed sleeves for the bachelor's degree; long, closed sleeves with a slit at the arm or wrist for the master's degree; and full bell double sleeves for the doctor's degree. Bachelor's and master's degree gowns have no trimming. For the doctor's degree, the gown has velvet edging down the front and three bars of velvet across each sleeve in the color representative of the academic major or degree.

Most gowns are the traditional black; a different colored gown worn by a faculty member indicates the color of the college or university from which the faculty member graduated.

Academic caps in North America are usually the mortarboard style for all degrees. The cap for the doctor's degree may be made of velvet and may have a gold tassel instead of the color usually worn to represent the academic discipline. In place of the mortarboard, some North American colleges and universities have adopted the European style cap, which is called a tam.



PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

A medallion or seal of office worn by the head of an educational institution is a practice that also dates to the Middle Ages. In those times, a seal was used to mark documents as official. Wearing the seal eventually became a symbol of authority. The presidential medallion of Lancaster Bible College is a cast of the College Seal, incorporating a Conestoga wagon, an open Bible, and the College verse, 1 Peter 1:25, "The Word of the Lord endures forever." The Conestoga wagon reflects the historical heritage of Lancaster County, and represents sending forth spiritual pioneers and laborers from LBC. Behind the Conestoga wagon is the open Bible, signifying that the foundation of Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary and Graduate School is the Word of God, as also indicated by the College verse.



SERVANT'S TOWEL

Since 1933, servant leadership has been the culture of Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary and Graduate School. The mission of LBC is to educate Christian students to think and live a biblical worldview and to proclaim Christ by serving Him in the Church and society. Christ was the ultimate example of servanthood, as God Incarnate willingly humbled himself by taking the form of a man.

On the night He was betrayed, Jesus took not only the bread and the cup as lasting symbols of His self-giving love, but also a servant's towel. He stepped down from the seat of honor, took off His outer clothing, put a towel around His waist and washed His disciples' feet. In so doing, He offered them a profound and radically counter-culture demonstration of the very heart of God. The joy-filled life in which He invites His followers to participate involves taking up the towel with Him.

The servant's towel is more than a symbol at Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary and Graduate School. It is a tangible expression of our mission, reminding each graduate that everything they have accomplished and will accomplish comes by participating in the servant ministry of Jesus Christ.

The servant's towel is reminiscent of the emphasis placed, throughout students' LBC experience, on serving one another in love. Today, our graduates receive not only academic degrees, but also towels as they embark on a new phase of their servant ministry to the Church and society. The servant's towel contains a printed reminder of Jesus' ministry to His disciples. Our prayer is that our graduates will accept the challenge to follow Christ's example of servant leadership.
