

INAUGURATION KEYNOTE SPEAKER

ED STETZER, DMin, PhD

Dr. Ed Stetzer is a professor and dean at Wheaton College where he also serves as Executive Director of the Wheaton College Billy Graham Center. He has planted, revitalized, and pastored churches, trained pastors and church planters on six continents, has earned two master's degrees and two doctorates, and has written hundreds of articles and a dozen books. He is Regional Director for Lausanne North America and is frequently cited in, interviewed by, and writes for news outlets such as USA Today and CNN. He is the Founding Editor of The Gospel Project, a curriculum used by more than 1.7 million individuals each week for Bible study. His national radio show, Ed Stetzer Live, airs Saturdays on Moody Radio and affiliates.

Dr. Stetzer and Dr. Kiedis enjoy a long friendship borne of mutual respect, deep appreciation for each other, and shared participation in God's Kingdom work through church planting.

OUR SIXTH PRESIDENT



THOMAS L. KIEDIS. DMin. PhD

Dr. Thomas (Tommy) L. Kiedis was named the sixth president of Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary & Graduate School effective February 1, 2020. Today he carries two symbols of the office: the Holy Bible and the presidential medallion bearing the College Seal.

The Holy Bible symbolizes the institution's commitment to the Word of God, a hallmark of its 89-year history. The image of the Bible is incorporated into the College Seal along with the College Verse, 1 Peter 1:25. Each President of LBC | Capital holds a Bible in their presidential portrait, acknowledging the deep spiritual legacy of this institution and dependence upon God to lead it into the future. The Bible carried today by President Kiedis belonged to former president Gilbert A. Peterson, bearing handwritten marks of daily study, sermon notes, and prayers.

The presidential medallion bears the College Seal and represents various elements of the institution's history. It was commissioned and worn by former president Dr. Gilbert A. Peterson, who began the tradition of passing it to his successor. Dr. Kiedis received the medallion from his predecessor, Dr. Peter W. Teague. Each President has made it part of their academic regalia to be worn on ceremonial occasions.

Dr. Kiedis' appointment to the presidency of LBC | Capital followed 40 years of service to the church and biblical higher education. Before his presidency he served as a senior pastor at Spanish River Church in Boca Raton, Florida, where he started in 2007 as the Director of Leadership Development and Church Planting. Prior to Spanish River Church, President Kiedis served as the Dean of the Chapel and Assistant Professor of Ministry at Palm Beach Atlantic University, and for many years as a pastor and church planter.

President Kiedis earned his bachelor's degree from Mid-South Bible College, MARE from Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary, DMin from Fuller Theological Seminary and PhD in Leadership from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky.

President Kiedis has had extensive time in the classroom at the undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral levels. His roles have included Assistant Professor of Ministry at Palm Beach Atlantic University, Associate Professor of Leadership at Knox Theological Seminary, and Adjunct Professor at both Reformed Theological Seminary (Boca Raton) and Capital Seminary & Graduate School. Dr. Kiedis' focus has been leadership and leadership development. He loves to help leaders maximize and multiply their lives for God's glory, which he does through teaching, writing, and consulting via leaderslifeandwork.com.

Dr. Kiedis and Shannan, his wife, have been married since 1980 and have six adult children and 23 grandchildren. They enjoy time with their family (especially at their Arkansas getaway), back roads and small towns, photography, and hot rods.

MICHAEL W. VAN BELLE, JD

Mr. Van Belle is vice chair of the Board of Trustees, representing the governing body of LBC | Capital and the 89- year history of the institution. Mr. Van Belle has been a member of the LBC | Capital Corporation and the Board of Trustees since 2017. He was the senior vice president of High Industries in Lancaster, Pennsylvania until his retirement and holds a juris doctor degree from the University of Tennessee.

THE REVEREND LUKE DONALD LE DUC, MTh

Rev. Le Duc is the senior pastor of Wheatland Presbyterian Church in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, educated at the University of Chester in Wales. His participation today symbolizes the emphasis on local church ministry by LBC | Capital and President Kiedis. The Kiedises joyfully embrace Wheatland as their church home.

TRICIA WILSON, MS

Provost Wilson leads the academic enterprise of LBC | Capital. Her participation today also represents the members of the President's Cabinet, providing integrated strategic leadership in support of the college mission. Through her work toward a PhD in Higher Education at Azusa Pacific University, Provost Wilson is participating in research dedicated to student, faculty and institutional thriving.

RINEY C. AMERSON, AS

Mr. Amerson is a talented vocalist who often leads worship at Spanish River Church in Boca, Raton, Florida, where Dr. Kiedis served as senior pastor before coming to LBC | Capital. An electrical engineer by trade, he uses his musical gifts to focus hearts on Jesus Christ in his local church. His participation in today's celebration speaks to a friendship with Dr. Kiedis forged over ten years of being early morning prayer partners.

PETER W. TEAGUE, EdD

Dr. Teague holds the titles of President Emeritus, LBC Ambassador, and Distinguished Professor at LBC | Capital. God's faithfulness was displayed in a myriad of ways over the two decades of his presidency from July 1, 1999 to January 31, 2020. Dr. Teague's ministry career spans 48 years of Christian education and leadership development and he holds a Doctor of Education from Nova Southeastern University. Dr. Teague is a contributing editor and co-author for several books and publications and has been on the directing boards of numerous Christian and secular organizations. As past president and board member of the Association for Biblical Higher Education, he is also a longtime board governance consultant for ABHE institutions. Dr. Teague and his wife, Paulette, are the co-founders of Jessica and Friends Community, a faith-based organization in York, PA offering services and supports to individuals with autism and intellectual disabilities.

RAY A. NAUGLE, EdD AND JULIA R. HERSHEY, EdD

Together Drs. Naugle and Hershey represent two generations spanning 39 years and three presidents at LBC | Capital. Moreover, their presence at the podium is symbolic of God's faithfulness in the history of LBC | Capital and the lives of its people. Dr. Naugle served as vice president and dean for 26 years during the presidencies of Dr. Gilbert A. Peterson and Dr. Peter W. Teague until he retired with the honorary rank of Distinguished Professor. His daughter, Dr. Julia (Naugle) Hershey graduated from LBC | Capital in 1998 and returned as a professor in 2009. She was later named chair of the Education Department and now serves as Associate Provost for Academics.

ROBERT F. BIGLEY, DMA

Dr. Bigley has been on the faculty of Lancaster Bible College since 2007 and currently serves as the Director of Choral Studies and Director of the Arts and Culture series for both the Lancaster campus and The Trust Performing Arts Center in downtown Lancaster. He worships with the Kiedises on Sundays as a member of Wheatland Presbyterian Church.

SAM GROSS '24

"Vision at Night" was composed by Mr. Gross '24 based on Daniel 7:13-14,

"In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed."

As a sophomore in LBC's Music Composition program, Gross was commissioned to compose a piece for the LBC Chorale. Gross collaborated with Dr. Daniel Carver, Assistant Professor of Bible & Theology, to select a passage of Scripture in the original Aramaic language. As Dr. Carver provided direction in understanding the language, Dr. Robert Bigley, Director of Choral Studies, Dr. Bruce Gerlach, Adjunct Professor and Dr. Paul Thorlakson, MWPA Chair, provided guidance through the composition process. As a testimony to LBC's commitment to biblical integration and in honor of the Inauguration of sixth president Dr. Thomas L. Kiedis, this piece is debuted as part of today's ceremony.

LBC | CAPITAL CHORALE

Directed by Dr. Bigley, the auditioned singers of the Chorale include students from the Music, Worship. & Performing Arts Department as well as undergraduate students from several other disciplines. The Chorale performs multiple times per year and tours regionally and internationally. With a wide-ranging repertoire, the ensemble frequently collaborates with other artists, which have included composer Stephen Schwartz, Irish hymn writers Keith and Kristyn Getty, Dove Award-winning singer Michael Card, the Grammy-nominated vocal ensemble New York Polyphony and the Lancaster Symphony Orchestra.

MBSSY

Directed by Mr. Ryan Shenk, Professor of Worship Arts, this auditioned undergraduate student traveling team comprised of band and vocals leads worship and performs at a wide variety of off-campus events during semesters and a summer tour.

MISSION OF THE COLLEGE

Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary & Graduate School exists to educate Christian students to think and live a biblical worldview and to proclaim Christ by serving Him in the Church and society.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Lancaster Bible College was founded by Henry J. Heydt in September 1933. Eight daytime students and 14 evening students were enrolled in the original class, which met in the Convention Hall at West Orange and Pine Streets in Lancaster. William J. Randolph ('50) succeeded Heydt as President. From 1954 to 1961, President Randolph moved the school toward accreditation, and the size of the campus grew, initiated by a gift of land in 1957 from Mr. and Mrs. J. Martin Esbenshade.

In 1961, the school's academic dean, Stuart E. Lease, was elected President. During his 17-year presidency, the student body grew to more than 400 students, and the campus expanded to 36 acres. In 1973, the school earned provisional approval to grant the degree of Bachelor of Science in Bible, and the school officially became Lancaster Bible College (LBC).

When Dr. Gilbert A. Peterson began his duties as president in 1979, he focused on debt reduction. Within five years, LBC raised more than \$500,000 toward financial stability and more than \$1.5 million toward the school's endowment. Additional land was purchased, bringing the campus size to 100 acres.

In 1999, Dr. Peter W. Teague became LBC's fifth president. During his tenure the Good Shepherd Chapel, Olewine Dining Commons, Peterson Hall, Charles Frey Academic Center and Donald H. Funk Athletic Field were completed. He oversaw the acquisition of new locations in Philadelphia and Washington, DC, championing collaborative partnerships with churches and other educational institutions. Additionally, the Teague administration added online undergraduate programs and expanded the graduate school to offer terminal degrees.

On February 1, 2020, Lancaster Bible College welcomed its sixth president, Dr. Thomas L. Kiedis. Dr. Kiedis came to LBC from Spanish River Church in Boca Raton, Florida where he served as senior pastor for 10 years. He was a member of the college's Corporation since 2012, taught graduate courses as an adjunct faculty member and for six years served as the lead mentor for the church planting concentration of the Master of Arts in Ministry program.

Since the start of his presidency, Dr. Kiedis in partnership with the President's Cabinet, faculty and staff, guided LBC | Capital through the Covid-19 pandemic and continued the effort to add global online programs, more than doubled in two years. Building on the foundation laid by Dr. Teague, he has cast a vision for LBC as a "destination location" attracting undergraduate students from across the country, and continuing to extend the college's mission through the Philadelphia and Washington DC locations, collaborating effectively in global education.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia of gown and hood are believed to have had their beginnings at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carryover from the times when the clergy who operated the universities wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter or to collect alms when worn as shoulder capes.

While originating from medieval times, academic attire has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any trappings of rank or social standing underneath. Gowns are usually designed with pointed sleeves for the bachelor's degree; long, closed sleeves with a slit at the arm or wrist for the master's degree; and full bell double sleeves for the doctor's degree. Bachelor's and master's degree gowns have no trimming. For the doctor's degree, the gown has velvet edging down the front and three bars of velvet across each sleeve in the color representative of the academic major or degree.

Most gowns are the traditional black; a different colored gown worn by a faculty member indicates the color of the college or university from which the faculty member graduated.

Academic caps in North America are usually the mortarboard style for all degrees. The cap for the doctor's degree may be made of velvet and may have a gold tassel instead of the color usually worn to represent the academic discipline. In place of the mortarboard, some North American colleges and universities have adopted the European style cap, which is called a tam.

The scarlet trustee gowns are emblazoned with scarlet facing panels and rouge sleeves trimmed in white braid. The hood features the satin red and white colors of Lancaster Bible College. The scarlet, velvet, and eight-sided doctoral tam is a departure from the usual mortarboard and is similar to those used by certain European universities and by some other American institutions to denote trustee rankings. These gowns add to the significance of this occasion and represent the dedication and support of the Board of Trustees of Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary & Graduate School.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

A medallion or seal of office worn by the head of an educational institution is a practice that also dates to the Middle Ages. In those times, a seal was used to mark documents as official. Wearing the seal eventually became a symbol of authority. The presidential medallion of Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary & Graduate School is a cast of the College Seal, incorporating a Conestoga wagon, an open Bible, and the College verse: "The Word of the Lord endures forever." (1 Peter 1:25). The Conestoga wagon reflects the historical heritage of Lancaster County and represents sending forth spiritual pioneers and laborers from LBC | Capital. Behind the Conestoga wagon is the open Bible, signifying that the foundation of LBC | Capital is the Word of God, as also indicated by the College verse.




